#### A NOTE FROM OUR PRESIDENT

Dear Sewing Sisters,

As I unpacked my machine from its case after the retreat, I realized that I only changed the needle once or twice during the 5 day retreat. That prompted the question of "how often should I change the needle?" Here is what the experts say:

- · It is recommended that you change your needle after every 3 full bobbins used or every 2 pre-wound bobbins used.
- · It is also recommended that you change the needle after each project or if using a fabric that naturally dulls the needle such as leathers or heavy fleece.
- · It is ideal to change every 8 hours of sewing or with each new project unless it is a small project.

So, as you start your next project take a moment to clean out the dust bunnies and insert a new needle.

I'm happy to announce that for the 2020 Alaska State Fair, the Alaska Sewlutions is going to award two \$25 Jo-Ann gift cards on behalf of the American Sewing Guild. These awards will go to the Judges Choice winners for both junior categories (Junior A and Junior B). We feel these awards are fitting with the purpose and mission of ASG which is to engage in activities for educational and charitable purposes, to further advance the art of sewing. We love seeing the projects submitted by children and look forward to this award as a way of encouraging them.

#### LASER WORKSHOP OPPORTUNITY


If you're interested in learning more about using a laser cutter/engraver to make your sewing dreams come to life, consider a small workshop with member Emily Longbrake:

"In January 2020, I'd like to host a **free** workshop at my house in Anchorage to make laser cut appliques. I can host ~8 people or so for a half day or evening to demonstrate basic analog and digital design techniques and use the laser to cut them out.

"I recently bought a 60W laser that can cut a wide range of materials including fabric, batting, and leather as well as 1/4" acrylic and wood. The bed size of 14x16" is great for cutting quilt blocks or small, intricate applique shapes that would be really difficult to cut by hand.

"Participants would be welcome to bring a machine to sew while taking turns with the laser. I can supply small samples of a range of materials."
