Chapter Advisory Board Minutes, October 28, 2023 at Pioneer Ridge B&B

Present: Rae Longbrake, Alice Stevens, Beverly Holmes, Janai Comer, Julie Gleason, Ada Gleason, Kathy Lunning (recording meeting minutes for vacant secretary position)

Elections: Rae is waiting to hear back from ASG on term limits for the CAB. ASG wants the CAB Change Form to be submitted by December 1st. Discussion was held about our elections being done at the Holiday Party. It was discussed that we must have the form to ASG by December 1st then perhaps we move the elections to the Fall Retreat Chapter Meeting.

It was discussed that it should be considered for all winter CAB meetings to be done by ZOOM due to the possibility of bad weather.

NG Meetings were tabled. It was discussed that perhaps we need to consider changing the day and/or times. This would allow different people to attend. Some guilds are finding that they are closing as their members are aging out. Evenings were discussed by many people even though Saturday mornings are convenient for some, it is a time to get caught up on daily chores if you are working.

It was decided to have a combined NG Sit and Sew Day. Alice volunteered her sewing room for us to meet. We will be holding it on May 4,2024 from 10 am to 4 pm,

It was suggested to survey members to see if they would be willing to share a skill with the group for a monthly meeting. Rae will send out a survey to the members in January 2024,

Retreat Question - Janai and Megan discussed the rate to charge for the Retreats as the cost is dependent on the amount of overnight guests. For the lower rate, we need 15 overnight guests for 2 days. At this retreat, Megan had to come to stay so that we had enough people overnight. It was decided to charge the higher rate, which is 12 overnight guests. Rather than refund the extra amount, it should be given to the housekeeping staff at the B & B.

Meals for the retreats were discussed. It is felt that people were not volunteering for meals as it is completely donated. It was decided that guests are to give \$10. For each meal that they partake in. This would be on the honor system. If \$10/Per day was charged for the meal and added to the room rate then the chapter may be subsidizing the meals and there are members who are not here.

It was discussed to talk to Etta about cooking again for the Spring Retreat since it is a smaller retreat. Kathy will speak to Etta about this possibility.

Rae will let us know the inventory of the excess Community Day Sew Projects. It will be decided what to do with it at the January CAB meeting.

Are you put off a bit about making professional looking collars? Check out this blog post "Sewing Super Sharp Collar Points on Shirts" I've used both methods mentioned and prefer the Thread Tail method which is applicable to any points on garments & works like a charm. blog.closetcorepatterns.com

AGAIN, I also highly recommend the "Express Collar and Collar Band" sewing method in Nancy Zieman's book, Sewing Express, pages 15-19!

Creamy Sweet Potato Bacon Chowder (dairy free)

Prep Time: 10 mins

Cook Time: 25 mins
Total Time: 35 minutes

Yield: serves 4

5–6 slices bacon (sugar free bacon for Whole30 compliant) 2 tbsp butter, ghee, or coconut oil for completely dairy free

1/2 onion, diced small2 cloves garlic, minced

3 cups of homemade broth (find recipe HERE)

2 medium/large sweet potatoes, diced small (about 4 cups)

1 bay leaf (like this)

1/4 tsp dried thyme (like this)

1/4 tsp dried dill (like this)

2 cups thinly sliced kale, tough ribs removed (I used Dino kale)

1 cup full fat coconut milk (where to get BPA free coconut milk)

salt and pepper to taste fresh parsley for garnish

Instructions

- 1. Cook bacon in a large skillet until well done and crispy. Set aside.
- 2. Meanwhile, melt 2 tablespoons of fat of choice (butter/ghee/coconut oil) in a large pot. Add onions and cook until translucent and beginning to brown. Add garlic and cook another 30 seconds.
- 3. Add broth, sweet potato, bay leaf, thyme, and dill. Bring to a boil, reduce heat and simmer (covered) until potatoes are tender, about 12-15 minutes.
- 4. Stir in sliced kale and cook until wilted and bright green. Add in coconut milk and season with salt and pepper.
- 5. Serve immediately, garnished with chopped crispy bacon and parsley.
